Health Curriculum – Year 10. Next term the Year 10 classes will each receive 5 x 1hour sessions from two external facilitators (plus a teacher), on Violence and Coercion. Studies show that teaching effective violence prevention methods to young people makes them better equipped to engage in respectful relationships and build pro-social behaviours and skills.

The programme is run with ACC and the Police in partnership, and is designed for NZ Secondary School students from Year 9 to 13, but this year will be presented to the Year 10 students only.

It is designed to promote safe, healthy and respectful relationships among students and hopefully reduce sexual and dating violence in and outside of the school environment, improving young people's ability to relate without conflict. The aim is to increase knowledge and awareness of sexual and dating violence, to try and change attitudes and behaviours, build the students' ability to treat others with respect and to negotiate consent, and most importantly to teach them to expect respect themselves.

The programme is aligned with the Health and Physical Education learning area and key competencies of *The New Zealand Curriculum*
