## PRINCIPAL'S COMMENT

Tēnā koutou,

As we approach the final stretch of the term, it is vital for our Year 10 to 13 students to focus on their upcoming assessments. For our Year 10 and 11 students, the reading, writing, and numeracy tests are essential checkpoints, and for our Year 11 to 13 students, the practice exams are a crucial part of their preparation for NCEA.

The tests in reading, writing, and numeracy are more than just a requirement for NCEA—they are fundamental skills that form the basis for future success. These assessments help us measure where our students stand, and give them the opportunity to reflect on their progress. For Year 10 and 11 students, doing well in these areas ensures they have the strong foundation needed for the academic challenges ahead. We have enjoyed seeing students attend the extra tutorial sessions that we have been running during Whānau Time on Wednesdays and lunch on Fridays.

Meanwhile, for our Year 11 to 13 students, the practice exams in Weeks 9 and 10 serve as a valuable rehearsal for their end-of-year NCEA exams. Practice exams provide students with an opportunity to test their knowledge, sharpen their exam techniques, and get used to the pressure of timed assessments. Doing well here is important, but it's also a chance to identify areas where improvement is needed before the final exams.

We want to give our senior students every chance to prepare thoroughly. Year 11 to 13 students will have study leave during the exam period to focus on their revision. For those who prefer to study at school, we will make a quiet space available for them when they are not sitting exams. It's important to note that grades from these practice exams will contribute to the Senior School Prizegiving, so doing well now can lead to recognition at the end of the year.

As parents and caregivers, you play a crucial role in supporting your children during this time. Encouraging effective study habits, ensuring they have a quiet space to focus, and helping them manage stress can make a big difference in their performance. As a school, we're doing our part by providing the tools, support, and guidance to help them succeed, but it's the consistent effort from the students that will ultimately lead to success.

With just a few weeks remaining, it's the perfect time for students to start reviewing their notes, practise past papers, and focus on areas where they feel less confident. Remember, the work put in now will pay off at the end of the year.

Let's continue working together as a community to help our students achieve their best. This is their chance to take charge of their learning and set themselves up for success not just in these assessments but in their overall journey as lifelong learners.

I also want to thank all the staff, students and community that have been involved in the many events and school trips that feature in this newsletter, our Year 7 & 8 newsletter and our panui from Te Rerenga Kotuku. Bream Bay College values these opportunities and acknowledges the effort and cost that it takes to smoothly and safely provide these platforms and real world contexts for learning.

## **BREAM BAY COLLEGE PRACTICE EXAMS**

Our senior students - Years 11, 12 and 13 - are sitting their NCEA Practice Exams in Week 9 and 10 of this Week 10: Monday 23rd September, Tuesday 24th September, Wednesday 25th September & Thursday 26th September.

Students are on Study Leave for these days. This means they attend school only for their exams and are at home studying when not at school for an exam.

A supervised silent study room (the Library) is available for each of these days so that if a student comes in on the bus for an exam and remains at school, the Library is available for silent study. A roll is taken for each period if a student is in the supervised Library. Normal school rules apply.



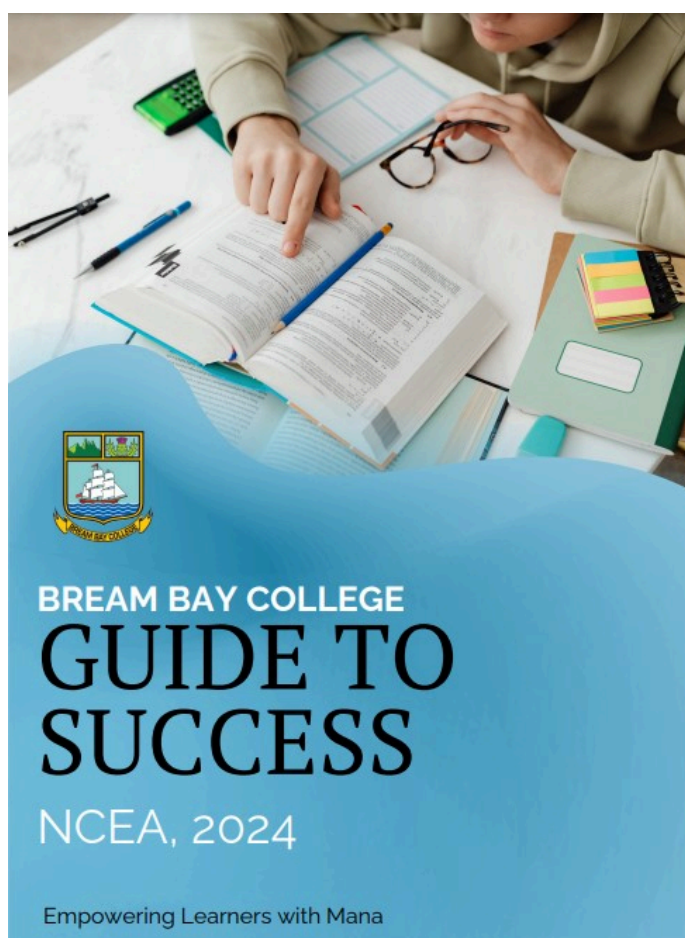

The reason practice exams are so very important:

- Practice exams help a student come to grips with all the conditions, requirements and rules around NCEA exams
- If a student is unable to sit their final NCEA exams, the practice exams are used to give them a grade for each standard.
- Practice exams give teachers specific feedback. Teachers can hone in on weaknesses and strengths for each student's revision so that the student improves in the final NCEA exam.

#### Important Information

1. Each student needs a charged device as many of these exams are done online.
2. The usual protocols for exams are in place: ie a silent exams environment, full uniform to be worn and punctuality is required.
3. Exams begin at either 9am or 1pm. Please see the timetable below.

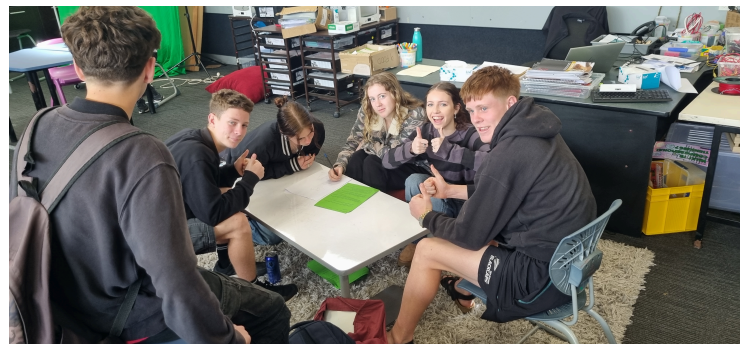

## SCHOOL CAR PARK

The staff car park will be closed between 3pm and 3.30pm daily.

This came into effect Wednesday 4 September 2024.

Bream Bay College's staff car park has been identified as a high risk area due to the limited pedestrian access through to the bus bay at the front of the school which is a significant risk to students at the end of the school day.

Student safety is a priority. The usual pathway is blocked due to the construction work being undertaken in the old science labs and the car park is currently being used by pedestrians. As a result we have made the decision to close the Staff car park between 3pm and 3.30pm. No cars will be able to enter or leave the car park during this time.

Car parking is available on Peter Snell Road where whānau can collect students.

## **PUBLIC HEALTH NURSE SERVICE AT SCHOOL**

Kia Ora! My name is Dennaye and I am the Public Health Nurse for the year 7 and 8 students at Bream Bay College.

I work with children over 3years to 12years of age; However, our wider team includes the youth specialty nurses and specialty ear nurses.

If you have health concerns for tamariki of any age, please feel free to contact me and we can put you in touch with the right team to support you.

### Mahi we do within schools includes:

- Organise and deliver immunisation programmes in schools.
- Work with schools to promote the wellbeing of tamariki, and their whānau
- Make referrals and liaise with school staff, health professionals (e.g. family doctors and specialists) and social agencies to support tamariki with health issues.
- Provide assessment and treatment for a sore throat, skin infections/conditions such as school sores and eczema
- Provide education for schools on supporting children with health issues such as Anaphylaxis, Asthma and Epilepsy
- Follow-up tamariki with identified hearing/vision needs

While these are some of the things we do, it is not a definitive list.
